Historical Note

The first nationally televised three-person presidential debate in U.S. history was held in the Athletic Complex Field House of Washington University on October 11, 1992. Approximately 100 million Americans and millions of people worldwide watched the debate on television. The format of the debate consisted of a moderator and a three-person press panel which asked spontaneous questions, followed by rebuttals by the three candidates. The three candidates at the debate were Independent candidate Ross Perot, Arkansas Governor (and future president following the 1992 election) Bill Clinton, and then president George Bush.

Scope and Content Notes

This collection consists of promotional materials, publications, artifacts, audiotapes and videotapes documenting the first Presidential Debate of 1992, held October 13, 1992 in the Washington University Athletic Complex.

Issues discussed: Chancellor pleased that preparations are going well; Hope (very remote) that Clinton will still come to the Quad, but complications because of Clinton campaign's wish to control half the tickets. At the same time, Clinton has not yet turned us down; much confusion and anger on campus over this. Chancellor outlines the evolution of the Clinton event and how the problems arose; Munny has been discussed as an alternate site -- if so, then shuttles need to be run from campus and shuttles cannot be provided by the University (illegal, as it would be considered a campaign contribution). Invitation to speak on campus (under the same guidelines Clinton had) has been sent to Bush and will be sent to Perot; Perot activities planned for Forsyth/Jackson lot and conformity with Clayton/U.City ordinances; Clinton event story is all over the papers and need to be prepared; Fred's concern that Clinton problems will be a color story in Sunday paper; buttons were a smash hit with the press; Need to communicate clearly with the students as well as with the press; distribution for today's Update; progress of documentary filming; student concerns about changes in Clinton event and student confusion over information in the Update. Student questions: What's happening to the carpet and the set for the debate stage? (carpet is rented; set will be transported to another debate site, wood used for camera platforms, etc. will be recycled). Are reporters going to recycle paper they use? (Fred: They don't use paper; it's all done with portable PC's and data lines). Is soda being served in cans, and if so, will they be recycled? (Probably cups rather than cans, but we need to provide receptacles for whatever is used). ABC interviewed behind Wohl Center the previous day; student T-shirts. Best rumor heard: Candidates will be tunneled into the Athletic Complex!. "Dress Up As Your Favorite Secret Service Agent" Day made the local evening news.; Video hookups at Edison, Brown, and Graham are ready to go and a variety of feeds will be available at all sites. Commission is extremely pleased with the University's work; Planned event for foreign journalists at Stix House to include Tom Eagleton, Robert Salisbury, and Susan Carlson; Arrangements have been made with Bi-State to provide shuttle service to the Munny from 3:30pm - midnight, subject to what happens with Clinton event; no parking on N. Brookings lot tomorrow; students will be selling T-shirts Sunday 11-6 in

Mallinckrodt; student/faculty/staff tours were well received yesterday and will be offered again today. Jumbo television cannot be airlifted into the Quad (too heavy) and cannot be put on the Brookings steps (security risk). Simulcast in Quad will have 15 x 20 foot projector and sound system instead. Rehearsals for student ushers and tear-down schedule; Anheuser-Busch party at Grant's Farm; University greeting for the candidates.
