Dear Mr. Willis,

Our grant to the Center for Documentary Media supporting the research and development phase of a film on the southern civil rights movement of the 1960's expired on September 30, 1978. A review of our files does not indicate receipt of the final narrative and financial reports.

You sent a report to Mr. David Davis on April 19, 1979 which included a financial accounting through December 31, 1978. However, you did not stipulate as to whether or not all Foundation funds had been expended. Since grant funds cannot be spent beyond the termination date of the grant without written permission of the Foundation, we are anxious to know the status of our grant funds, as well as the project. Was the film ever made and distributed?

We look forward to hearing from you soon as we are most anxious to close the files on this grant.
